1st Report of the Reconstituted Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the Faculty of Science

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the Faculty of Science (IQAC-FoSc) was newly constituted, at the meeting of the Faculty Board of Science held on 27.10.2020, as per the new guidelines sent by the Centre for Quality Assurance.

The first meeting of the IQAC – FoSc was held on 10/11/2020 under the chairmanship of Prof. P. Ravirajan (Dean/Science). The Chairman briefed the committee on the new composition and outline the tasks of the committee.

The Directress of the University Quality Assurance Unit Prof Meena Senthilnanthan attended the meeting on invitation and outline the important tasks of the IQAC including the responsibilities of IQAC during the forthcoming Programme Reviews at the faculty.

The committee decided to do the followings:

- Sending report to the meeting of the Faculty Board of Science (SFB) as fixed agenda will be available in the agenda of the meeting of the SFB.
- Sending quarterly report and annual budget requirement to the CQA
- Updating the Faculty and /or Departments web sites. Mr. S. Suthakar and Dr. K.
 Gajapathy were requested to oversee this activity.
- Developing a policy on disability at the Faculty or University Level. The IQAC/FoSc will work with CQA-UoJ.
- Compiling the research output of the academic staff. The Chairman/Faculty Research
 Committee shall be responsible to work on this task.

The IQAC of the Faculty of Science considered the Sub-committee Report to the QAC of the UGC

on Standard Setting in Student Assessments at its special meeting held on 13 November 2020 and

recommended the following to the UGC;

1. Since graduates from all state universities compete at various levels a common Grading

System, where in Y_A and Y_D are fixed, for all universities is recommended. Further the

committee suggests fixing $Y_A = 75$ and $Y_D = 30$

2. The committee further recommends, if there is any disparity in fixing Y_A and Y_D , a common

formula should be developed for its uniform applicability in all state universities.

3. The Board of Examiners shall have the guidelines (common for a faculty/ university) and

it should function irrespective of courses and/or course units.
